This is a specialist course designed to meet the needs of 16-19 year old students who have a Statement of Educational Needs or are not yet ready to move on. It is part of Ryburn Valley High School's Post 16 provision as a mainstream 11-19 Comprehensive School.

STUDENTS

- Students must be within the age range 16-19 (Years 12-14).
- Students should have a mixture of GCSE/Certificate grades. Where students have already achieved GCSE qualifications they may be able access Level 2 courses as appropriate and this will be discussed the course tutor.
- ELC – not needed, but should have an EHCP (Education, Health & Care Plan).
- There is a legal requirement that all students in the Sixth Form who do not have a GCSE Level 4 or above in English and Mathematics, are entered for this qualification and attend timetabled lessons.
- Students must have the ability to take a full and active part in the school's curriculum, albeit with appropriate support.
- Students are expected to attend regularly and past attendance will be taken into consideration when admitting prospective students.
- Students are expected to demonstrate appropriate standards of behaviour.

PARENTAL SUPPORT

- Students must have a supportive 'home' base.
- Parents/Carers must be willing to work in partnership with the school in its endeavour to help students resolve their presenting difficulties.
- Parents/Carers are encouraged to attend relevant meetings to discuss student progress.

SUITABILITY

- The school must be confident of its ability to meet student need, as part of which it must also consider the overall balance of its clients group.
- The school must be confident that it is able to work constructively with parents in supporting the ethos of the school.
