Outline the rationale for the choice of assessment evidence used, i.e. why the evidence above was used and how it supported the grading decision:-

Students completed evidence towards 4 units of work across year 12 and 13. 2 units were externally assessed, and 2 units internally assessed. External assessments took place as normal in January 2020 and January 2021. In line with exam board directives, the students continued with their course, and the work was marked according to the assessment criteria for each unit. We used Pearson assignment briefs for all internally assessed units of work. Due to lockdown and lack of time students did not fully complete Unit 14 aim C & D. Students produced detailed evidence covering a wealth of skills.
