Our photography and media departments allow students to hone their digital skills and explore how we engage and communicate with the modern world.

Our students excel in performance, taking their place front and centre at Open Evenings, assemblies, concerts, school productions and at our prestigious annual Academy Awards. Ryburn Dance Academy dazzle in competitions and perform internationally, visiting locations across Europe and in the United States. Our music department nurtures talent at all levels, with several bands, choirs and soloists performing regularly.

Our drama students are keen communicators, confident spokespeople and effective problem solvers. Our industry links have helped many students get parts on TV and film. The Heads and Assistant Heads of Year, Pastoral Support Staff and Welfare Officers support individual students and their families when challenges arise. We work closely with specialist local services and are part of Calderdale's Mental Health Support Programme.

Supported learning



This could include difficulties with communication and interaction; cognition and learning; social, emotional and mental health and sensory or physical difficulties. In all these cases, there are ways we can support students to enjoy learning and to reach their potential. With one of the biggest and best SEND departments in Calderdale, our experienced and expert staff ensure there are no barriers to learning at Ryburn.

Identity curriculum

A core part of our mission is to ensure that our students leave Ryburn as confident global citizens, equipped with the knowledge, skills and character they need to succeed personally, and the empathy and understanding of others to help make that future a kinder one.

To achieve this, we have created our own unique Identity curriculum - consisting of iGen, iD and iDays - to deliver PSHCE and more. Our expertise in this area has been recognised by Ofsted and as one of the few schools to achieve the Character Kitemark Plus.

iGen lessons centre around shared reading of literature. By stepping into the shoes of the characters, students explore and discuss a range of key themes in a safe environment with their peers. Our goal is to help students to develop into mature, well rounded individuals who think about who they are outside of the classroom. We're also passionate about the value of reading. Building this time into our regular weekly routine sets up a life long habit and improves literacy.

In their iD lessons, Year 7 and 8 students learn and practise transferable skills that help them with self-directed study, inspire them to follow different paths and have understanding of others' perspectives and experiences. As a Unicef Rights Respecting School, students learn about the rights of the child and how this applies to them and children around the world.

We continue our focus on personal development right through to Ryburn Sixth. We hold regular iDays for all year groups, when normal timetables are suspended to make way for specialist sessions delivered by teachers, visiting professionals and external agencies in order to provide a variety of experiences.



iGen has helped build my confidence in reading and when discussing important topics about the books we've read. Now I am a Reading Leader for English, assisting younger students with reading.

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Through our diverse curriculum and extra-curricular groups, we encourage our students to look beyond the school gates towards our local and global responsibilities. We are proud of our student leaders who seek to make the world a better place, taking small steps to make a big difference.


The future is bright
